SCHOOL BOARD



DESCRIPTION

Atlanta Public Schools (APS) is an independent system with no governance from the City of Atlanta's Mayor or the City Council. The Atlanta Board of Education (school board) creates policy for the public schools and appoints the superintendent who oversees the system's day-to-day operations.



School board members serve a 4-year term. There are <u>no</u> term limits. Members choose their chair and vice chair every 2 years.

The election of school board members is non-partisan. (Candidates don't run as members of a particular political party.)



NOTE: The school board has switched to staggered terms so half of the board (odd seats) will be elected in 2023 and other half (even seats) will be elected in 2025.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Must be at least 18 years old
- Must be a registered voter of the city
- Must have been a resident of the district for at least the past year
- Must <u>not</u> be an employee of the State Department of Education or a member of the State Board of Education
- Must not hold any other elective public office
- Must <u>not</u> be an employee of the Atlanta Board of Education
- Must <u>not</u> serve on the governing body of any private K-12 educational institution

SALARY


School board positions are considered part-time. Regular members are paid \$22,500 annually. The board's vice chair makes \$23,500 and the chair makes \$24,500.

COMMITTEES

Board members are nominated by the chair and confirmed by board members to serve on the following standing advisory committees:

- **Accountability Committee**
- **Audit Committee**
- **Budget Commission**
- **Policy Review Committee**

Each school board district is composed of a contiguous pair of city council districts.


KEY ELECTION DATES

Voting for Districts 1, 3, & 5 and At-Large Seats 7 & 9:

Tuesday, October 10, 2023: voter registration deadline Oct. 16–Nov. 3: early voting – including both Saturdays Tuesday, November 7, 2023: general election Tuesday, December 5, 2023: run-off election

A run-off election will occur for any race where no candidate receives more than 50% of the vote.






students from households with income below 185% of the poverty threshold








APS BUDGET

TOTAL EXPENSES: \$1.13 BILLION

FACTS

- APS employs approximately **4,200 teachers**.
- APS's total budget for 2023-24 is approximately **\$1.7 billion**.
- Approximately 50% of the property tax collected in the City of Atlanta goes to APS.
 (The other 50% goes to the City and the County.)
- A 1% sales tax collected in the City of Atlanta goes to APS to help fund capital projects such as the construction and renovation of school buildings.
